Protect Against the H1N1 Virus

As you know, health officials are concerned about the H1N1 Flu, better known as the Swine Flu, and the severe health effects associated with the virus. Knowing this and as influenza activity continues to increase, we should all take the time to understand and perform the following actions that can help prevent the spread of germs that cause respiratory illnesses; like the flu. We should all:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze and throw the tissue in the trash after use.

Wash your hands often with soap and water. If not available, use an alcohol-based hand cleaner.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. This is the easiest method of spreading germs.

Try to avoid close contact with sick people.

If you are sick with flu-like illness, the CDC recommends that you stay home and keep away from others as much as possible for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone. Keep in mind, your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.

Follow public health advice regarding the H1N1 vaccine, school closures, avoiding crowds, and other social distancing measures.

Be prepared in case you get sick and need to stay home; everyone should store a weeks supply of over-the-counter medicines, alcohol-based hand cleaner, tissues, and other related items that can help you while you are sick and contagious.

And finally, take the time to teach your children and practice these important prevention tips.

2009 Micropave Program

Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc. was awarded the 2009 Micropave Program at a recent City Council Meeting. The pre-construction conference was conducted on Wednesday October 21, 2009, and the contractor was given notice to proceed effective Monday October 26, 2009.

The first few days of work will consist of the contractor preparing their schedule and mix designs for submittal to the City for review and approval as well as setting up their staging area. The staging area will be located on the vacant city lot at Buchanan and Highway 93.

The following is the list of streets to be micro-paved as part of the program.

The contractor is responsible for passing out five-day and 48-hour notices to the neighborhoods that will be affected by the work. Street parking will be prohibited on the streets to be micro-paved the day they are paved. Notices for "no parking" will be placed on the street 48 hours prior to the day the area will be micro-paved. Vehicles parked on the street the day of the micro-paving may be towed at the owner's expense.

Once a section of a street is micro-paved, it is closed to traffic for four to six hours to allow the material time to cure. Emergency access will be provided at all times. Once cured, the area can be opened to traffic. If vehicles drive on the uncured (wet) micro-pavement, it will stick to car tires and

paint, be tracked onto their driveway and leave ruts in the new micro-pavement. The public is asked to obey the traffic control signs installed by the contractor for their safety, the safety of the contractor's crews and protection of the new micro-pavement during the curing period.

The contract time for the project is 45 calendar days. The contractor anticipates being complete with all work within 30 calendar days, approximately the end of November.
