Pedestrian Injured on Nevada Highway

On February 17, 2010 at approximately 6 p.m., Boulder City Police received a 911 call regarding a pedestrian being struck by a motor vehicle in front of 1410 Nevada Highway.

When officers arrived on the scene, they found a 56 year old male lying in the right-hand lane, closest to the curb, of northbound traffic. The male, a Boulder City resident, had been crossing Nevada Highway when he was struck by a 2001 PT cruiser, driven by a Las Vegas man. The driver was traveling northbound in the right-hand lane. The driver and occupant of the PT Cruiser were not injured. There was minor damage to the automobile.

The pedestrian who was struck by the automobile was taken by the Boulder City Fire Department to the Boulder City Airport where he was transported by Mercy Air to University Medical Center (UMC). He suffered from a broken leg and sustained injuries to his chest and head. At the time of this press release, the pedestrian was reported to be in stable condition.

During the early evening hours of February 17, Nevada Highway northbound was restricted to one lane for several hours while police investigated the accident, which is still under investigation.
