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## Landfill Rates Effective For Bills Dated on or After August 1, 2007

At the July 10, 2007 City Council Meeting, new landfill maintenance fees were adopted. These fees are effective for billings dated on or after August 1, 2007.

Single family, mobile home estate residences, multiple family residences and mobile home parks will pay \$10.61 per month for semi-weekly service plus a \$1.50 per month landfill maintenance fee for a monthly total of \$12.11.

Commercial, public

buildings and motels will be charged \$16.26 for the first trash can and \$16.26 for each additional can for two day pick up service. For six day pick up service, a fee of \$48.68 for the first can and \$48.68 for each additional can plus a \$0.45 per each cubic yard landfill maintenance fee applies. These trash cans are furnished by the property owner or tenant.

A landfill maintenance fee of \$0.0075 per pound will also be insti-

tuted for refuse brought into the landfill over the scales.

The landfill maintenance fee has been established to pay for the eventual closure of the existing landfill and opening of a new cell estimated at \$4.8 million.

During this meeting, residential and commercial recycling was discussed and will continue. Also discussed was exploring alternatives for existing programs and this will continue to be monitored and reviewed for effectiveness. The City will examine the current residential drop-off procedures and hours at the landfill as well as the amount of outside waste being deposited at the site.



## Redevelopment Agency Update

At the July 10, 2007 Redevelopment Agency Meeting, the following projects were approved for grant funds.

\$7,500 was awarded to the Western Inn, 921 Nevada Way, for replacing the shingled roof with new Spanish tile to make it look more like the nearby historic district and other motels in the immediate area.

\$25,170 was awarded to Chicago Title, 517 Hotel Plaza, for exterior improvements, a covered and landscaped patio area behind the building, original maintenance of landscaped areas in the easement adjoining the property, sidewalk improve-

ments, parking lot restructure, new deco tiles, new windows and other items.

An amount of \$1,281 was awarded to All Seasons Marine, 1604 Nevada Highway, for an amended request. Originally, this project was awarded \$20,600 for signage, remodeling of the store front and blacktop. The additional \$1,281 was incurred for change order items not included in the original proposal.

The total revenue generated by the RDA for the last quarter of FY 06-07 was \$77,324. Of this, \$38,662 is

set aside for the RDA grant program to businesses, landlords or tenants. Four grant program projects were funded in this last quarter, leaving a balance of \$266,934 to be brought forward to FY 07-08.

## City Council Update

- At the last Council Meeting, held July 7, the Council approved a Resolution authorizing an agreement between the City and the



Clark County Regional Flood Control District (CCRFCD) to reimburse the City \$248,000 for extensive repairing, inspecting, reshaping, cleaning, engineering and vegetation control at the City's flood control areas. Boulder City has participated in this program with the CCRFCD for the past 18 years.

- The Council awarded a bid to Cobalt Contractors in the amount of



\$128,948 for the replacement of the heating, ventilation and air conditioning system at the LA Water & Power Building. These funds come from the Redevelopment Agency. Project should be completed by mid-September.

- The Council approved a resolution for the approval of the final payment of the Animal Shelter Parking Lot. Project total came in at \$5,600 below the project budget of \$79,415.10 and on schedule.



For a considerable period of time, the City has had in effect business license fees and City facility use fees. During the July 7 City Council meeting, these fees were clarified and presented with some minor changes.

- ⇒ Each year, all non-profit groups are required to obtain a Non-Profit Permit, which costs \$25. This is separate and apart from a Special Event Application listed below. Non-Profit groups also pay a fee of \$10 per day for each vendor or concessionaire in an event.
- ⇒ When a non-profit group, such as the Chamber of Commerce, wishes to present an event such as the Spring Jamboree, they prepare a special event application and pay a \$100 fee to the Parks & Recreation Department.



Since this event hosts a number of food vendors, arts, crafts and other exhibitors, the Chamber also pays to the City a \$10 per day vendor fee. A portion of this fee is then submitted to the state by the City's Utility Department.

- ⇒ There is NO FEE for a garage sale permit, but you are required to obtain a permit from the Utility Department. Residents are permitted to hold two garage sales per year.
- ⇒ For mobile food vendors, the annual business license fee is \$80, \$40 semi-annually.

- ⇒ For a complete list of all business license fees and permits, please contact the Utility Department at 293-9219.

- ⇒ Regarding a fee schedule for use of City facilities, the following lists some of the more popular facilities.

- ⇒ \$50/first two hours for use of the Multi-use Building in Broadbent Park and \$5/each additional hour. Charge is \$60/first two hours with use of the kitchen and \$6/each additional hour. A \$50 cleanup deposit is required but refunded if the area is left clean.

- ⇒ The 30 foot gazebo at the Veterans Memorial Splash Park rents for \$40/day and the 16 foot gazebo is \$20/day. Cleaning deposit applies.

⇒ Parks including Broadbent, Frank Crowe, Bicentennial, Wilbur Square, Hemenway, Del Prado, Oasis, Lakeview, Xeriscape, North and South Escalante and Veterans Memorial are available at no charge to Boulder City individuals and groups.



- ⇒ Special events application and event fee is \$100. Should your event not be approved by the Boulder City Special Events Committee, \$50 will be refunded to you. This fee is paid to Parks & Recreation.

- ⇒ Cleanup deposit for a special event is \$100.
