



Passport Changes

Effective February 1, 2008, several changes were implemented by the U.S. Department of State Passport Division.

A Passport Card is now available to meet the specific needs of those residents in communities along the northern and southern border of the United States.

The Passport Card can only be used for land and sea travel between the United States and Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean and Bermuda. It will provide those frequent travelers a less expensive and more convenient alternative to a passport.

The Passport Card should be available sometime in the spring of 2008. However, citizens may apply in advance for the card.

For first time applicants of the Passport Card, cost

will be \$45 for adults and \$35 for children under 16. Each fee includes the execution fee of \$25. Adults with full-valid passports issued within the last 15 years can apply for the card by mail at a cost of \$20.

Also from the U.S. Department of State Passport Division, new passport forms available. You can obtain a new form in the City Clerk's office in City Hall and on the Department of State website, <http://travel.state.gov/passport/passport>. These forms are for those individuals applying for a new passport or renewing their passport.

Passport fees increased, effective February 1,

2008, as follows: 1) First time adult applicants must pay the \$75 passport book application fee and a \$25 execution fee, for a total of \$100; 2) Minor applicants under the age of 16 must pay the \$60 passport book application fee and a \$25 execution fee, for a total of \$85; 3) Renewal fees will not include the \$25 execution fee; 4) other fees may apply if requesting the application be expedited, and 5) the City's \$10 fee for individual passport photos did not increase.

Also effective February 1, 2008, a two-parent consent will be required for minors under the age of 16. Minors age 16 to 18 are required to execute and sign the DS-11 form, and minors under the age of 16 will no longer be required to execute the DS-11 form.

Voter Information

Be sure you are registered to vote and have submitted your annual request for an Absentee Mail Ballot should you need one. If you have moved, changed your name, or wish to change party affiliation, you must complete a Voter Registration Application. Forms are available in the City Clerk's office on the 2nd floor of City Hall, 401 California Avenue.

If you will not be in Boulder City to vote or

if you are unable to physically visit the various voting locations, you are required to complete an Absentee Mail Ballot Request form annually. If you would like, the form can be mailed to you. Remember, even if you have completed an Absentee Mail Ballot Request in the past, you must submit one again in 2008.

Voter registration deadlines are July 12, 2008, for the August 12, 2008, Primary Election; and October 4, 2008, for the November 4, 2008, General Election. Congressional, state and county offices will be voted upon in the Primary Election. For further information, go to <http://www.co.clark.nv.us/ELECTION/home.asp>.

Mail Ballot Request Deadlines are August 5, 2008, for the Primary Election; and October 28, 2008, for the General Election.

Council and Committee/Commission Agendas and Packets on the Web

The City Clerk's office would like to provide the following explanation regarding accessing the City Council agendas and agenda packets, containing all the staff reports and back-up material for each agenda item, and the agendas and packets for each committee and commission meeting held.

On the City's website, www.bcnv.org, click on the link Agenda Packets on the home page. This takes you to a listing of all agendas. Click on the link for the agenda you wish to look at or print.

You are taken to a page where you will

be able to choose the previous month's agendas or packets or both.

If you would like the minutes of the previous month's meeting, choose the agenda packet. Minutes from the previous meeting are included in the packet.

For example, the minutes of the February 12, 2008 City Council Meeting are included in the agenda packet for the Council Meeting of February 26, 2008.

To access agendas and agenda pack-

ets older than one month, go to the Boulder City Web Link. You can reach Web Link by clicking on the Public Records link at the top of the home page. On Web Link, minutes are listed as one complete document, unlike the way they are included in an Agenda Packet.

In addition to agendas, packets and minutes you can access budgets, campaign contributions and expenses, land sales ordinances and resolutions.

Parking Vehicles on City Streets—An Update

At the Feb. 26 City Council meeting, Council members gave direction to City Manager Vicki Mayes regarding the parking of oversized-vehicles on City streets.

After considerable discussion from the Council and the public, it was moved to continue with the current parking ordinance, which allows

owners of over-sized vehicles to park them in front of their home for an indefinite period of time.

Police Chief Tom Finn said the Boulder City statutes, which allow this, could supersede State Law, which mandates removal of oversized vehicles after being parked for more than a 72-hour period.

It was also recommended that the City's Safety Committee research areas where oversized vehicles were parked indefinitely that might be a possible safety concern.

These safety recommendations will be presented to the City Council at an upcoming meeting.
