Annexation Analysis for Eldorado Valley Lands

At the October 14 City Council meeting, members approved spending up to \$60,000 to have the Slater-Hanifan Group perform an in depth analysis on the impacts to City services if land in the Eldorado Valley is annexed into the City.

The analysis would provide the effects put upon the Boulder City Police and Fire Departments; the potable and raw water services with the expected water use for the annexed territory; street maintenance dollars per linear mile of traveled lanes and analysis of any identified equipment that would be needed; and a traffic impact analysis to identify the current level of service for city streets and non-U.S. highway streets within the study area and the expected level of service for same upon build-out of the annexed area.

A final report from Slater-Hanifan Group will be presented to the City with a summary of the findings in these areas along with recommendations to identify the economic impact of the annexation on Boulder City. This report will also include a list of public infrastructure that Boulder City will be required to build or upgrade to accommodate the increased development.

The financial summary of this report will compare property tax revenue for both the property in its current state and the ultimate build out versus the reoccurring maintenance expenses and the one time expenses. The income will include the revenues generated from water and sewer fees. The financial analysis will cover 10 years, or more, per Boulder City's request, to compare the up front costs versus the ultimate build out scenario.

Landfill Recycling Facts

Commercial Cardboard Recycling – When Waste Logistics, doing business as Boulder Disposal, took over operation of the landfill on January 1, 2005, there were only 23 commercial customers using cardboard recycling. In 2008, there are 78 commercial customers using cardboard recycling with bins provided free of charge by Boulder Disposal. This is a 239% increase in cardboard recycling. If you would like to receive a bin for disposing of cardboard, please call Boulder Disposal at 293-2276.

Residential Recycling- From 2005 to the present, Boulder Disposal has a residential participation rate of 28%. The company purchased 6,000 baskets to accommodate the residents. There are baskets left, so please, call Boulder Disposal at 293-2276 if you would like a basket. Recycling baskets are also available at City Hall on the lower level, just beyond the stairs. Please feel free to pick one up for your recycling needs. And remember, recycling day is Wednesday. Have your materials set out in front of your home by 7 a.m.

Recycling Rate –This rate is figured by taking the total of recyclables divided by the municipal solid waste put in the landfill. Currently, Boulder City's recycling rate is between 11-13 %. The more we recycle, the less waste goes into the landfill and the higher our recycling rate.

According to Finance Director Tim Inch and Landfill Manager Robert Martello, the Southern Nevada Health District has confirmed Boulder City the highest recycler in Clark County. Despite this accomplishment, the City is exploring even better recycling programs.

Holiday Schedule—Please take note that Boulder Disposal WILL NOT pick up trash on Thursday, November 27, Thanksgiving Day, and Thursday, December 25, Christmas Day.

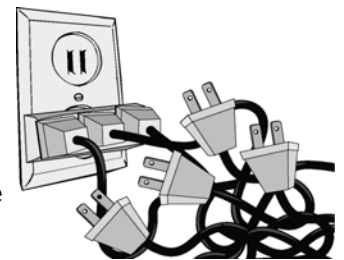
SAFETY TIP

From Your Building Inspection Department

Overloaded electrical outlets can cause a fire or electrocution.

- Never overload electrical cords or outlets.
- Be sure the total amount of energy used by appliances and lights plugged into the outlet does not exceed the capacity of the outlet and cords.
- Use only listed equipment that has been tested by a product safety laboratory.
- Don't use appliances or lights that have damaged cords.

- Extension cords should not be used as a substitute for permanently wired outlets.
- Electrical cords must be the proper wire size for the load they serve.
