On Tuesday, January 24, City Council honored Parks and Recreation Director Roger Hall for forty-five years of service! Hired in August of 1977, he is the longest tenured current City employee based on his service date (we could only find one other employee with a longer tenure: Marti Corderman with 48 years). Roger was pretty fresh out of the University of Northern Colorado when he was hired as a part-time temporary employee/Sports Coordinator making \$4.25 an hour. He was integral in the development of several parks in Boulder City, including Veterans Memorial Park and

Boulder Creek Golf Course. He was the first manager of the Municipal Pool. He has worked with nine City Managers and held three different positions before being promoted to Director in June 1985. He is well respected by municipal Parks and Recreation leaders around the state and is an integral part of the Boulder City staff and leadership. Roger’s long-term commitment to the community has built relationships with various foundations, businesses and community leaders. Joining him at the dais were his wife Tracey, his mother Erma and daughter Kristen—his staff was in the audience! Congratulations, Roger!

Sharing Boulder City’s Story with Utah HS Students



Brok Armantrout of the Finance Department recently gave a lecture on Boulder City’s efforts for renewable energy to a high school in Lindon, Utah. On January 13th, he spoke to a class of high school students at Maeser Prep Academy. The presentation provided a brief history of the City, put the city size in context that the students could understand, and then focused on the different solar technologies deployed in Boulder City, including battery storage. He also outlined some of the challenges, and explained how the reliable revenue stream opportunities could

be applied to cities across the country. The hour-long presentation ended up running 110 minutes, after extensive questions from students.
