Court Marshal Earns Law Degree

Congratulations to BC Court Marshal Dain Szafranski for recently earning his Juris Doctorate degree at Mitchell Hamline School of Law! Dain says it was a long but fulfilling process. “When I graduated from Bonanza High School in Las Vegas in 1999, I had a 1.61 GPA because I did not value traditional education,” Dain said. “The issue was not motivation, but rather a lack of guidance, backed by stubborn youthfulness.” Since becoming a full time BC employee in 2012, he’s looked for ways to learn and achieve more in his career. After talking to a recovery court participant about goals, he decided that he should listen to his own advice. He enrolled in ASU Online to finish a bachelor's degree. “I worked hard to balance my full-time job, manage my time with my children, and complete the remaining two years of my Criminology and Criminal Justice degree in only 14 months,” Dain said. “I could not do UNLV’s program because they require night school. I would have had to give up the little time I had left with my children.” Dain found a Law School hybrid program that required just two weeks on-campus attendance each semester, and the rest could be completed online. After three years of classes (including full-time summer classes) Dain finished in May! “If you want to be the best, you have to be willing to push yourself harder. I plan to use my degree to perfect myself and my department,” Dain said. “I play an integral role at the BC Courthouse and the citizens of this town deserve to have the best experiences that can be provided. I hope that my example will be contagious to those in the recovery court that I serve as well as to my children.”

City Recognizes Juneteenth - City Offices Closed Monday, June 19



The Nevada Legislature approved a bill last week that makes Juneteenth (June 19) a legal holiday statewide. Most City offices will be closed and full-time employees will receive a paid holiday next Monday, June 19, 2023. (For Courts, Fire Department and Police Department staff, see your supervisor for more information on your schedule). More than two years after President Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, more than 250,000 slaves in Texas were liberated on June 19, 1865.
