



What's Happening around the City of Boulder City

Record Heat Coming this Week—Be Prepared

Category	Risk of Heat-Related Impacts
Green 0	Little to no risk from expected heat.
Yellow 1	Minor - This level of heat affects primarily those individuals extremely sensitive to heat, especially when outdoors without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.
Orange 2	Moderate - This level of heat affects most individuals sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration. Impacts possible in some health systems and in heat-sensitive industries.
Red 3	Major - This level of heat affects anyone without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration. Impacts likely in some health systems, heat-sensitive industries and infrastructure.
Magenta 4	Extreme - This level of rare and/or long-duration extreme heat with little to no overnight relief affects anyone without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration. Impacts likely in most health systems, heat-sensitive industries and infrastructure.

We live in the desert, but some days, temperatures come close to record-setting heat. The National Weather Service issued Extreme HeatRisk (magenta on the scale) Excessive Heat Alert through Sunday. This level of rare and/or long-duration extreme heat is defined by little overnight relief. Extreme heat increases health issues like dehydration, heat cramps, heat stroke and exhaustion. Please stay well-hydrated; avoid alcohol; wear lightweight, light-colored clothing; avoid outdoor activities between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.; use air conditioning and remain in cool places during the day. Be sure to check on elderly family and friends, as they are more susceptible to heat illness. Safeguard children, checking on them regularly. Limit your pet’s time outdoors and avoid hot pavement. Children and pets should never be left unattended in vehicles - EVER.
