



Councilman Walton Named to Colorado River Commission



Boulder City Councilman Steve Walton was appointed to a two-year term on the Colorado River Commission as the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) appointment. Boulder City is the one local municipality within the SNWA that purchases power directly through the CRC network. The CRC manages and protects Nevada's allocation of hydroelectric power that is generated and marketed by the federal government. Western Area Power Administration (WAPA), a federal power marketing agency under the Department of Energy, markets the power as well as distributes it over a sizable network of high voltage transmission lines. "In an average year, WAPA markets and delivers more than 25,000 gigawatt-hours of hydroelectric power. This amount represents 100 percent of the annual energy needs for about 2.3 million average American homes." Congratulations to Councilman Walton on this prestigious appointment!!!

Contractors Start Work on Two Major Projects



Boulder City's contractor, Precision Concrete Cutting, will have technicians start work grinding raised sidewalks. The process begins today (7-22) around the school areas and could take a few weeks to complete. Work will be complete in the school areas before the start of the new school year. Miller Environmental, Inc. will begin asbestos and lead paint abatement at the Historic Water Filtration Plant located at 300 Railroad Avenue. The contractor has started removing old debris items from the building prior to beginning abatement activities. They will be removing asbestos containing materials in drywall, ceilings, floor tile and window putty. They will also remove loose and flaking lead paint throughout the building. So

as not to damage the character and structure of the historic building they will not be doing any high pressure washing or sand blasting to remove paint. Any remaining lead paint will be encapsulated with a Lead Barrier Compound. The majority of the work is being performed inside the building. Funding for the project comes from a Commission for Cultural Centers and Historic Preservation (CCCHP) grant, and City of Boulder City grant matching funds through the RDA. Miller anticipates being complete with the abatement activities in approximately 6 – 8 weeks, if not sooner.
