**Boulder City Police Department Receives Traffic Safety Grant Funds  
for impaired driving enforcement and  
to participate in the Joining Forces Program**

Boulder City — Boulder City Police Department (BCPD) is pleased to announce its participation in the Joining Forces traffic safety campaign that combines 30 law enforcement agencies across the State of Nevada focused on traffic safety awareness and enforcement. The campaign series will run from October 2024 through September 2025. Boulder City Police Department was also awarded grant funding for education and enforcement campaigns for impaired driving that will run during the same period.

“The Boulder City Police Department is committed to keeping Nevada’s roadways safe for everyone. Participating in the Joining Forces and Impaired Driving campaigns allows us more opportunities to reduce traffic fatalities and educate the public on safe driving habits through high visibility patrols,” said BCPD Traffic Sergeant John Glenn. “With these grants, the goal is to reduce serious and fatal crashes and have an impact on the increase in impaired driving in Clark County.”

Joining Forces is a high-visibility, multi-jurisdictional effort to increase safety on Nevada's roads. The program places focus on increased awareness and enforcement of traffic laws, including distracted and impaired driving, seat belt use, speeding, pedestrian safety, motorcycle, bicycle, and other traffic laws. Boulder City Police Officers are able to participate in the Joining Forces and Impaired Driving traffic safety campaigns through grants provided by the Nevada Department of Public Safety, Office of Traffic Safety and the National Highway Safety Transportation Administration.
