Update on Nevada Task Force 1



From Clark County: "The estimated number of missing people from the flooding in Kerr County, TX has dropped from more than 100 to three. The change in the potential number of victims has not changed NV-TF1's assignments along the Guadalupe River. The team has had squads in boats on the water doing searches of areas other teams have not been able to access. NV-TF1 team members also are doing secondary searches of debris piles along the river shoreline that were previously searched by another team. The searches are going quickly because there is less debris to remove. An additional six K9 teams have been assigned to the team to assist with the searches. The team continues to be actively engaged in the work and focused on finding those who are missing. No date has been set yet on when NV-TF1's deployment in Texas will end.
