Historic Preservation Award for 2011

The Boulder City Historic Preservation Committee has determined that the Boulder City Historic Preservation Award for 2011 is hereby granted to:

The Gaal House at 540 Birch Street

in recognition of the care taken to remodel this home in keeping with the historic character of the Birch Street area, which is within the Boulder City Historic District as listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Gaal residence was chosen for this award because the remodel demonstrates the following:

- It provides an excellent example of what can be accomplished in a "down to studs" renovation and remodel of a historic property.
- The new construction, visible from the street, so closely replicates the original materials, sizes, textures and colors of the surrounding historical homes that a pedestrian or motorist would be unaware that it had been totally renovated and now incorporates many energy efficient features and modern technology.
- An addition on the rear of the home matches the original dwelling construction so well that it is indistinguishable from the original.


