Historic Preservation Award for 2016

The Boulder City Historic Preservation Committee has determined that the Boulder City Historic Preservation Award for 2016 is hereby granted to:

Building 100 in the USBR Date Street Complex

located within the Boulder City Historic District as listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation's Building 100 in the Date Street Complex was chosen for this award because the renovation incorporated the following attributes:

- The restoration and rehabilitation of this building from the inside out has resulted in a streetscape restored to its original historic significance.
- The Bureau enlisted prominent preservation specialists and the State Historic Preservation Office to ensure that correct historical preservation protocol was followed.
- Not only was the exterior restored to its original appearance, including the restoration of the cupola which was missing for years, but the building was remediated and retrofitted seismically.
- This building will now stand for many additional years as a valuable part of the Boulder City Historic District.


