Historic Preservation Award for 2018

The Boulder City Historic Preservation Committee has determined that the Boulder City Historic Preservation Award for 2018 is hereby granted to:

The Schrick House at 1360 Denver Street

in recognition of the comprehensive rehabilitation of this early 1930's home located within the Boulder City Historic District as listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Schrick residence was chosen for this award because the rehabilitation incorporated the following attributes:

- In the late 1990's, the homeowners altered and added to the historic property in order to make the home more functional while retaining the property's historic character.
- The exterior renovation is compatible with the Historic District and included recreating the historic exterior color, reusing the original red clay tiles, preserving and repurposing the original front door, and sensitively blending new stucco with the original stucco.
- The addition of the large covered front porch resembles a small portico, a feature typical of the style of Spanish Colonial Revival. The attention to detail continued with the interior renovations as well.
- Most of the work was lovingly performed by the homeowners. Such dedicated amateur preservation efforts help the community at large have a greater appreciation for the City's history and its historical image.
