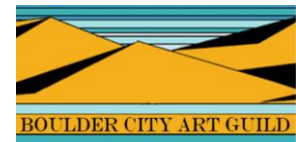
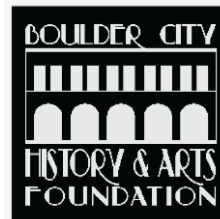

<p>9:00 – 10:00 a.m.</p>	<p>START at the former Los Angeles Dept. of Water & Power building (600 Nevada Way) to pick up an event MAP and talk about what’s happening with historic preservation in Boulder City with representatives of the LADWP, the Boulder City-Hoover Dam Museum, members of the Historic Preservation Committee and the City.</p>
<p>These locations open from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. except as noted</p> <p>(This event 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.)</p> <p>(Speaker there 11:00 a.m. – noon)</p>	<p>Take your pick from a number of historic venues to visit, on your own schedule. Plan to visit them all!</p> <p><u>Los Angeles Dept. of Water & Power / 600 Nevada Way</u>: This location is also hosting the entries for this year’s HISTORIC ART CONTEST, featuring the historic Browder Building as the subject. Sponsored by the BC Art Guild and the BC History & Arts Foundation – you can vote for the winner! (Voting until 1:00 p.m.; building open until 2:00 p.m.)</p> <p><u>Browder Building / 550 Nevada Way</u>: The Silver State Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) will be providing brief “street theater” presentations throughout the event (approx. every 15 minutes) on the fascinating story of Ida Browder, one of Boulder City’s original business pioneers and notable person of influence, in front of the former café that she built.</p> <p><u>Water Filtration Plant / 300 Railroad Avenue</u>: The BC History & Arts Foundation is again sponsoring TOURS and LECTURES at the historic Water Filtration Plant. BCHAF historian Ray White will do presentations on how the plant operated in the past.</p> <p><u>The Bureau of Reclamation / 1200 Park Street (parking on street, and lot access off Nevada Way to the rear for handicap parking)</u>: The Bureau of Reclamation is opening up their historic administration building for an Open House with information about their history and recent & proposed preservation efforts in town.</p> <p><u>RR Museum / 601 Yucca Street</u>: Visit the Nevada State Railroad Museum/Nevada Southern Railway and learn about their exciting plans for future expansion. (Train rides also available for purchase at 10:00, 11:30, 1:00 and 2:30.)</p> <p><u>Bullock Field (Old Airport) / 1401 Boulder City Parkway (access from Madrone Street)</u>: Get a look inside the old hangar! (Hangar open 10-2) Also: hear Mark Hall-Patton (Director, Cannon Aviation Museum at McCarran Airport) talk about the history of aviation in Nevada (from 11-12).</p>
<p>2:00 – 2:30 open house</p> <p>2:30 – 3:30 program</p>	<p>Events at Boulder City High School / 1101 Fifth Street</p> <p>Come during the open house if you haven’t toured the “new” school yet, and share your memories of the “old” school with other alums. The high school building may be new but there’s lots of history inside!</p> <p>Join historian and author Dennis McBride (Director, Nevada State Museum LV) as he hosts the telling of interesting stories of Boulder City’s past by local speakers about the original pioneers of Boulder City.</p>
