Historic Preservation Award for 2019

The Boulder City Historic Preservation Committee has determined that the Boulder City Historic Preservation Award for 2019 is hereby granted to:

The Historic Water Filtration & Purification Plant at 300 Railroad Avenue
located within the Boulder City Historic District as listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Water Plant was selected for this award because:

- The building was one of the first permanent structures built by the Bureau of Reclamation in 1932.
- It provided clean drinking water to thousands of employees constructing Hoover Dam and their families.
- The structure is a visual landmark in Boulder City and is an excellent example of industrial architecture with elements of Italian Renaissance Revival style.

The Committee especially would like to recognize the Boulder City History and Arts Foundation; Scott Donnelly, president of Cooper Roofing & Solar; and the community-at-large for their awareness, appreciation and support for the preservation of the historic Water Plant.
