Pool Gets \$1.3 million from Anonymous Donor



Last week, Boulder City received two checks totaling \$1,346,743.60 from an anonymous donor, specifically for the “Community Pool” located in Broadbent Park. The donation was unsolicited and the donor wanted to remain anonymous. “Boulder City is fortunate to have the support of generous donors who care about the community,” said City Manager Al Noyola. City staff will recommend that Council accept the donation during the Monday, June 10 City Council meeting (one day earlier due to elections). Railroad Museum expansion closer after recent Senate vote

Assembly Bill 84 (A.B. 84), a bond reauthorization bill that includes funds for State Museums, has passed both the Nevada Assembly and Senate and now goes to the Governor’s desk for his signature. Testimony for the bill suggested up to \$25 million for construction of the Southern Nevada Railroad Museum and Linear Park in Boulder City, bringing the expansion project one step closer to a reality. A.B. 84 covers phases one and two of the three phased, \$35 million project, which includes a new 9,700 sq. ft. visitor’s center, new boarding platforms and the Boulder City Linear Park that would include children interactive amenities. A.B. 84 provides \$217.5 million in state bonding authority for projects across the State of Nevada. Voters approved the original bond for conservation projects in 2001.

Animal Shelter & Senior Center team to provide seniors with free pet food



Boulder City Animal Control is teaming up with the Senior Center of Boulder City to make sure our most vulnerable residents don’t have to choose between their meal and food for their pets. Eligible seniors will be able to pick up pet food from

the pantry at the Senior Center. “Shelter Supervisor Ann Inabnitt’s hard work and dedication has increased the number of adoptions at the Animal Shelter and provided a framework that landed a \$25,000 grant from Maddie’s Pet Foundation earlier this year,” said Mayor Rod Woodbury. “Her expertise has been a blessing to the people and pets of Boulder City, and we are fortunate to have her working for the City.” Pantry hours are Monday, Thursday & Friday between 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. Seniors in need of pet supplies should contact the Senior Center for more information at 702.293.3320.
