Donors Make Sure BCPD K-9s are "Vested"



In what the organizer called one of their fastest efforts ever, donors raised \$5200 to purchase vests for Boulder City Police Department's K-9 Luna and K-9 Lloyd. Like many police agencies, bulletproof vests for K-9s are not in the budget. Non-profit *Keeping K-9s in Kevlar* raises community funds to help build rapport with law enforcement and fund K-9's with bulletproof (Kevlar) vests. The quality and safety provided by Kevlar vests (made by the company K9 Storm) come with a high price: \$2,600 each. The K9 Kevlar vests protect against stabbing, shrapnel, and bullets shot from common handguns. "Thank you to all who helped us raise enough to buy these specialized vests. There are times when Luna and I are in dangerous situations, and while I have a vest, she is

vulnerable," said Officer Alan Nutzman (*in photo, on left, with K-9 Luna; Officer Armando Salazar and K-9 Lloyd on the right*). "Luna is more than a dog; she's part of the family and I want to keep her safe. I'm thankful that Keeping K-9s in Kevlar understands that bond and wants to keep her safe, too." Fundraising lasted a mere 48 hours, with a donor named Wes Ward stepping in Friday morning and pledging the remaining funds.
