



Boulder City Parkway Complete Street Quick Facts

Purpose:

- Improve safety and mobility especially for pedestrians and bicyclists by providing wider detached sidewalks and adding bike lanes
- Grow economy by creating an inviting and more aesthetically pleasing community
- Lower transportation cost by providing transit options
- Improve health by promoting physical activity (walking, biking, skate boarding)

Location: Boulder City Parkway between Veteran's Memorial Drive and Buchanan Boulevard

Cost: Approximately \$18.2 million (includes design, construction, construction management, underground utilities, striping and signage, traffic signal equipment upgrades, streetlights, landscaping, street renovation, sidewalks, medians, curbs, gutters, new driveways and pedestrian crossings)

Funded by: Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada, Nevada Department of Transportation and City of Boulder City

Cost to Boulder City: \$626,380 for water and sewer improvements including new water services with backflow prevention devices, water valve replacements, fire hydrant replacements, replacement of a water valve vault and sewer main replacements including the addition of one new manhole.

Artistic Sculptures: The inspiration came from the I-11 sculptures, which ties our projects together and celebrates Boulder City as the Home of Hoover Dam. Cary Baird with Stantec, sub-consultant to the CA Group, was the landscape architect for both the Boulder City Parkway project as well as the I-11 project.
