## **Joining Forces Grant Announced for BC Police Department**

**BOULDER CITY** – Boulder City Police Department (BCPD) is happy to receive another grant from the Nevada Department of Public Safety, Office of Traffic Safety to support the participation in Joining Forces traffic safety campaigns during the coming year. This year's award of \$47,000 will help BCPD team up with other agencies in the Las Vegas Valley to keep roads safe during Joining Forces events from October 2020 through September 2021.

Joining Forces is a high visibility, multi-jurisdictional statewide effort to increase safety on Nevada's roads by increasing enforcement and awareness of traffic laws. The goal is to reduce crashes and save lives by focusing on impaired driving, distracted driving, seat belts, speed, and pedestrian safety.

"People take for granted the impact even the slightest mistake can create when speeding, driving distracted, under the influence or aggressively," said Boulder City Police Chief Tim Shea. "We hope that by having extra patrols on the roads, drivers will exercise better judgement, slow down and drive safely."

Boulder City Police Department receives an annual grant from the Nevada Department of Public Safety, Office of Traffic Safety to support participation in "Joining Forces" traffic safety campaigns during the year.

Law enforcement personnel will continue to enforce traffic safety laws year-round as part of their commitment to reduce crashes and save lives. Whether you're the driver, a passenger, or a pedestrian, Boulder City Police remind everyone to make safety a top priority.
