City Business

- Beginning January 1, 2021, the City will resume late fees or disconnect service for non-payment of utility bills. Contact the Utility Billing office at 702.293.9244 to discuss options; you can also contact Emergency Aid to apply for assistance.

- City Hall and all City buildings have limited public access. Visitors must comply with self-screening, body temperature below 100.4 degrees and a mask must be worn. Flu Season is Here: Get Vaccinated!

We've been so focused on COVID-19; now is the time to think about flu as well! The CDC recommends getting the flu vaccine to help health care providers respond to the COVID-19 outbreak more effectively. Southern Nevada Health District offers flu vaccine at all Health District clinic locations each fall. No-cost flu clinics are also offered at various locations. An annual flu vaccine is the best way to reduce your chance of getting the flu. The vaccine takes about two weeks for antibodies to develop and offers protection from seasonal flu for about a year.

Getting immunized ensures that protective antibodies are in place before flu activity is at its highest. You can be vaccinated anytime during the flu season. The viruses included in the vaccine change each year based on the strains expected to circulate during flu season. Check individual public health center locations for hours of operation at:
