



Tips for a Great Pool Season!

Sunshine and warmer temperatures mean summer is approaching! Many families are getting their pools and spas ready for summer. Before you start, there are a few things to note:

- Please don't drain pool water into gutters, storm drains, or into the street.
- Most homes in Boulder City have a sewer clean out in front of the home or near the house. Tips on how to find it can be found on the Southern Nevada Water Authority website at www.snwa.com/landscapes/pools-and-spas/index.html.
- Homeowners who hire a pool service to drain their pool are responsible for ensuring their pool is drained properly.



Boulder City staff frequently receive calls from people concerned when they see large volume of water flowing down the street gutter. When this occurs, we must dispatch employees to find the source (including on evenings and weekends) to make sure it's not a broken water main.

Water-saving tips:

- Cover your pool: pool can lose thousands of gallons of water per year to evaporation. Pool covers reduce evaporation by 90 percent, limit windblown debris, and conserve energy.
- Protect the pool from wind: wind exposure can increase evaporation in uncovered pools. Plant trees and shrubs that buffer your pool, but won't shed or drop leaves in the water.
- Maintain pool filters: wash cartridge filters when your pump operating pressure increases by 10 psi (pounds per square inch). You can wash cartridges on landscape areas since chlorinated pool water is diluted with clean water.
- Manage water quality: test water frequently and maintain appropriate chemical balances.
- Heat pool conservatively: warmer water means higher evaporation rates. Professionals recommend 78 degrees Fahrenheit as the ideal recreational pool temperature.
- Test for leaks: turn off the automatic fill valve. Place a bucket on a step where the bucket rim is at least a few inches above the water line. Place a heavy weight in the bucket and add water until the water level inside the bucket is equal with the water level in the pool. Leave the bucket and pool undisturbed for several hot days, then compare the water level in the bucket to the water level in the pool. If the water level in the bucket is noticeably higher than the water level in the pool, you may be losing water to a leak. Contact a pool leak detection specialist.

2021 General Municipal Election



Voters who choose to vote via mail ballot may safely drop off their voted ballot at the City Clerk's office. For added convenience, the Parks and Recreation Building will also be a mail ballot drop-off site during the period of early voting. For those who prefer to vote in-person instead of by mail, you will need to do one of the following:

If you have your mail ballot, surrender your voted or unvoted mail ballot (preferably in the packet sent to you) to an election official at the voting site; or

If you do not have your mail ballot, you will be required to sign an affirmation at the voting site swearing that you have not already voted in the current election and that you understand no one may attempt to vote or actually vote more than once in the same election.

EARLY VOTING will be held at the Parks and Recreation Building, 900 Arizona Street, Boulder City. The early voting schedule for the June 15, 2021 Municipal General Election is as follows:
