City Business

- City Hall is open to visitors Monday through Thursday, 7 a.m. until 6 p.m. If you are not vaccinated, you must wear a CDC-Approved face covering while inside City Hall.
- Residents can also handle non-emergency business by phone at 702.293.9329 during regular business hours, with limited hours on Friday and Saturday, or email using the staff directory at www.bcnv.org/Directory.aspx.
- The general public may attend meetings held in City Council Chambers. Those attendees who are not vaccinated will be required to wear a CDC-approved face covering. The City will continue to hold City Council, Committee and Commission meetings via live stream at www.bcnv.org/streaming and live on Channel 2 (Cox Cable subscribers only).
- July 1, 2021, late fees and disconnection processes for utility payments resumes. (The City halted this practice in March 2020 due to the pandemic.) City Council earmarked CARES Act funding through Emergency Aid of Boulder City. Call 702.293.0332 or visit www.eabcnv.com for more information.
- Utility, business license and permit payments may be made at the back window of City Hall or online at www.bcnv.org, where you can set up autopay as well.
- Fingerprint services and DMV services at the Boulder City Police Department are suspended until further notice. (The DMV operates a kiosk at Albertson's Supermarket, 1008 Nevada Way, Boulder City.) Sex offender registration services are available by appointment but both the registrant and the staff must wear masks during fingerprinting.
- All special events and public gatherings within City parks and facilities MUST be approved by the Special Event Committee. Call 702.293.9256 for information and applications.
